On the 1st Sunday of each month, around 3:PM, U.S. EST*, joining with participants all over the world, in the privacy of their own homes, members come together in prayer, forming a living world wide heart of prayer in unity with the Sorrowful and Immaculate Heart of Mary.

* For those who cannot pray at 3:00 U.S. EST, please pray at anytime on the 1st Sunday of the month, with the intention of solidarity with the prayer group.

The World Wide Prayer Group of Our Lady of Emmitsburg centers on the Rosary with the addition of a reflection of a message given previously by Our Lady of Emmitsburg.**

A reflection on one of Our Lady's previous messages should occur during the Fourth Mystery, after the Lord's Prayer, and after the first 5 Hail Mary's are said. This is done to represent the occurrence of the apparitions to Gianna Talone Sullivan, during the Public Marian Prayer Group meeting.

**Our Lady of Emmitsburg's messages reside in the public domain and are accessible and free to everyone with Internet access . But, because these messages are numerous, capable of filling volumes, suggestions of prayerfully selected messages will be offered, for those who may not have the time for a search. 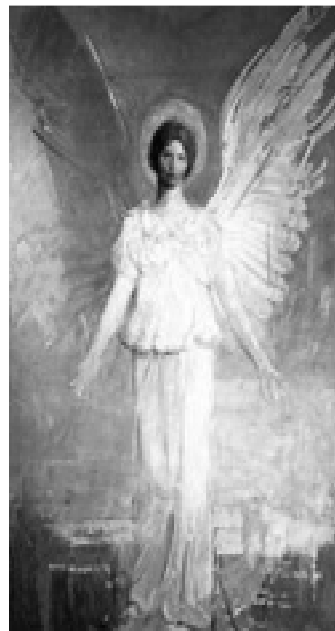

Make a commitment to an action

Based on the message or your prayerful reflections, make a commitment to take some action that aids in deepening your relationship with God, helping you to live out the Gospel message more fully. Many people find that writing this action down not only helps in remembering it, but also helps to make the idea more concrete.
